KSU and Community Launch Hurricane Relief Supply Drive

Kent State University united with Kent area community partners recently to initiate a much-needed hurricane relief supply drive to benefit people in Florida affected by Hurricane Irma and its subsequent floodwaters. The partners included the Kent Chamber of Commerce, Family and Community Services, Fab Express, PARTA, City of



Kent Community Development and Health Departments, International Paper and the Kent Interfaith Alliance.



To promote the drive a large banner, designed pro bono by Glyphix Studio - a student run design studio - was draped across a tractor trailer parked at Willow Street and Main Street. Last month, local citizens made contributions of more than 350 pounds of adult and children's wipes, diapers, incontinence products, paper towels, facial tissues, paper plates, plastic cutlery, and women's and men's underwear.

"These contributions will go a long way toward

making sure individuals and families can meet their basic needs as they try to get their lives back on track," said Kelvin Berry, director of Economic Development and Community Engagement in the Office of Government and Community Relations who helped in coordinating the drive. "This was a real team effort that came

together in a very short period of time," added Dr. Geraldine Hayes-Nelson, who created and led the drive in response to concerns expressed by a number of KSU employees. *Continued on page 3*.

The 2017/18 Holiday Shutdown Schedule

Kent State University's Holiday shutdown for 2017 will begin Sunday, Dec. 24, 2017 at 10:30 p.m. In addition, the university will close Tuesday, Dec. 26 (President's Day) and Wednesday, Dec. 27, thru Monday, Jan. 1, 2018. All offices will re-open on Tuesday, Jan. 2, 2018.

The December biweekly pay will be on Dec. 8 and 22. The December semimonthly pay will be on Dec. 15 and 22. The January biweekly pay will be on Jan. 5 and 19. The January semi-monthly pay will be on Jan. 12 and 31.

Employees not eligible for the paid leave include student employees, classified temporary staff, temporary agency staff, unclassified nine- and 10-month term appointments, short-term unclassified assignments and employees in a lay-off status. In preparation for this national On the Move University Challenge, faculty and staff making up Team Kent State converged on the Student Recreation and Wellness Center to get a head start on the opposition and compete for prizes as part of the "On the Move Kick Off Event." Employees took part in a slew of contests and activities, such as tug of war, archery, rock climbing, badminton, corn hole and Kin-Ball, while other colleagues mixed and mingled with Flash and other university friends.

"It was an amazing experience," says Kim Hauge, director, Employee Wellness. "Our employees were pumped!" Faculty and Staff were on the spin bikes, rock climbing with Flash, learning archery from Chris John and other student guides, and volleying their opponents in Kin-Ball!

pop-up challenges and prize drawings. Campus Kitchen is a national student-run non-profit that fights hunger and food waste. The organization prepares an average of 350 meals each week for individuals facing food insecurity in our local community. Last year, over 3,000 individuals assisted with meal prep and food delivery programs.





American Heart Association Recognizes Kent State for Workplace Health Achievement



The 2017 results of the American Heart Association Workplace Health Achievement Index were recently announced and Kent State achieved silver-level recognition for taking significant steps to build a culture of health in the workplace.

The American Heart Association created the index with its CEO Roundtable members, a leadership collaborative of more than 30 CEOs from some of America's largest companies who are committed to applying evidence-based approaches to improve their employees' overall health. The index uses science-based best

practices to evaluate the overall quality and comprehensiveness of workplace health programs.

More than 800 companies completed the index assessment for 2017, and of those companies, 67 percent received either Gold, Silver or Bronze recognition.

The association's Workplace Health Achievement Index allows companies to measure the effectiveness of their workplace health programs, as well as the overall heart health of their employees. Unlike other existing organizational scorecards, the index also scores companies on the heart health of their employees based on Life's Simple 7® – the association's scientifically validated definition of ideal heart health.

"I think it goes without saying that we are thrilled to accept this recognition and honor by the American Heart Association," says Kim Hauge, Kent State's director of employee wellness. "Providing a comprehensive and quality program that is measurable in terms of its ability to promote healthier, longer and more productive lives is of extreme importance."

- Benefit Plan Booklets for the new 85/60 plan will be available to review in the HR Forms Library prior to Jan. 1, 2018.
